AP High Court Civil Judge Syllabus 2022

The AP High Court Civil Judge Syllabus & Exam Pattern 2022 is published by the relevant authorities of the Andhra Pradesh High Court, along with the formal notification,. Before applying for the post, all eligible applicants are encouraged to review the AP High Court Civil Judge Syllabus 2022. Checking the most up-to-date AP High Court Civil Judge Exam Pattern 2022 is also essential for all applicants, as it provides a proper understanding of the exam's requirements and guides candidates to formulate a strategy.

It is very important for all the aspirants to go through the AP High Court Civil Judge Exam Pattern 2022 which is discussed in brief below.

AP High Court Civil Judge Exam Pattern 2022

The AP High Court Civil Judge Recruitment process will include three stages mentioned below:

1. Screening Test: MCQ based questions
2. Mains Examination: Written Test (Offline)
3. Viva Voce

For the purpose of shortlisting the applicants, the AP High Court will conduct Screening Test (Computer Based Test) for 100 marks comprising of 100 multiple choice objective type questions. The duration of examination will be 2 hours.

The applicants who secure 40% and above marks in the screening test will be shortlisted in the ratio of 1:10 of the available vacancies for written examination.

The marks obtained in the screening test shall not be added to the marks obtained in the written examination and they shall not be counted for determining final order of merit in selection of the applicants as the screening test is conducted for the purpose of short listing the applicants only.

The final merit list is prepared based on the marks obtained by the aspirants in the mains written examination and the Viva Voce.

Stage 1: Screening Test (Computer Based Test)

Stage 3: Viva Voce

Viva Voce will be of 50 marks. Any candidate who remains absent on stage 3 will be considered disqualified from the recruitment process. The main objective of this stage is to assess the suitability of the candidates for the cadre by judging the mental alertness, knowledge of the law, clear and logical exposition, balance of judgment, skills, attitude, ethics, power of assimilation, power of communication and intellectual depth.

Andhra Pradesh Civil Judge (Junior Division) Minimum aggregate marks to be secured in the written examination and viva-voce for selection

For selection to the post of Civil Judge (Junior Division) under Direct Recruitment and Recruitment by transfer, the Candidates under OC/EWS category must secure at least 60% marks in aggregate in the Written Examination and Viva-voce. The Candidate who are BC Category under Direct recruitment must secure at least 55% marks in aggregate in the written Examination and Viva-voce and the candidates who are SC/ST category under the Direct recruitment and Recruitment by transfer must secure at least 50% marks in aggregate in Written Examination and Viva-voce. The candidate who secure less than such percentage of marks will be ineligible for selection to the post.
