RECRUITMENT OF CANDIDATES TO THE POST OF CIVIL JUDGES

LAST DATE FOR ONLINE RECEIPT OF APPLICATION: 11.01.2019

Post of civil judges (junior division): 71

Age Limit: 38 years in case of SC or SC, 35 years in others

The Competitive examination for recruitment in the Civil Judge Cadre shall consist of:-

- (1) Preliminary Examination (Objective Type),
- (2) Written Main Examination (Subjective Type),
- (3) Viva Voce.

SYLLABUS/SCHEME

a. Preliminary Examination:-

The preliminary examination shall be conducted by way of objective Type Question Paper consisting of 100 marks and the syllabus for the said examination shall be the following, namely:

Part-A

Code of Civil Procedure, 1908
Negotiable Instrument Act, 1981
Transfer of Property Act, 1882
Indian Contract Act, 1872
Specific Relief Act, 1963
Indian Constitution
and Karnataka Rent Act, 1999

Part-B

Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973
Indian Penal Code, 1860
Indian Evidence Act, 1872

Part-C

General Knowledge- Test of Reasoning and Mental Ability

b. Main Written Examination:

Translation Paper (Max Mark- 100)

There will be one translation paper and the candidates will be required to translate passages in English into Kannada and Kannada into English. The passage will be from (1) Depositions, (2) Judgements and (3) Documents

Law Paper I (Max Mark – 100)

Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973

Code of Civil Procedure, 1908

The Indian Evidence Act, 1872

Principal of Pleadings and the Constitution of India

Law Paper II (Max Mark- 100)

Framing of issues and writing of Judgments in Civil cases

Law Paper III (Max Mark- 100)

Framing of Charges and writing of Judgments in Criminal Cases

c) Viva Voce (Max Mark- 100)

The Candidates General Knowledge, grasp of principles of law and suitability for appointments as Civil Judge shall be tested.

d) Computer Test (Max Mark- 25)

The test of knowledge of computers shall carry maximum 25 marks and such marks secured by the candidates shall be considered for ascertaining the suitability and computer knowledge of the candidates and shall not be aggregated to the total marks obtained in the main written examination and viva voce.

Note: Regarding (b) and (c), such of those candidates who desire to answer in Kannada may do so.

(e) (i) Minimum marks for pass in the Preliminary Examination shall be 50 for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and 60 for others.

(ii) Minimum marks for pass in each paper of the Main Written Examination shall be 40 for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and 50 for others.

(iii) Minimum marks for pass in the Viva-Voce shall be 40 for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and 50 for others.

Provided that no candidate who has secured less than the minimum marks specified above:

(i) in any paper of the Main Written Examination shall be eligible for Viva-Voce.

(ii) in any paper of the Main Written Examination or in viva-voce shall be eligible for appointment as Civil Judge.
